## Signs Out.....Check.....Cross Now

Our road patrols do a great job in all sorts of weather (apart from during electrical storms when they are not allowed to operate).

Given the responsibility that resides in the decisions and actions of our road patrols, all students involved are trained by the police.



Hence, the protocols they use are those issued by the police. They have no discretion when it comes to implementing the protocols. One of the protocols requires that they are only permitted to extend the signs if vehicles are outside the white diamonds painted on the road either side of the pedestrian crossing.

Please be patient when waiting to cross when using the pedestrian crossing. If it takes a while for the patrols to extend the signs it will be because they are following the required protocols.

## Education: The Past Nine Years

The Insight programme on Radio New Zealand National yesterday morning was devoted to a review of education during the last nine years under a National led government. If you have time it is worth listening to. As you would probably expect, given the subject was education and politics, the views expressed in the programme encompassed the whole spectrum - basically all points of the compass were covered! Commentating purely from the impact policy changes have had at Campbells Bay School have had over the years I would make the following points:

**National Standards:** The introduction of National Standards has had an impact on our school and I would suggest, for the better. While the standards themselves are arguable in terms of just how appropriate and clear some of them are, they have most certainly resulted in us delving deeper into how each student is achieving in reading, writing and maths. This 'delving' has taken the form of teachers inquiring into what we need to do to improve outcomes for students, particularly those who are not achieving as we would have expected them to. Of course we did this before but I would suggest we are doing this with added rigour and purpose.

**Reporting to Parents:** Reporting to parents in 'plain English' is another advance we have made (I believe). Based on considerable parental feedback we have continued to refine our reporting to parents including past achievements, school and national average achievement data.

**Focus only on maths, writing and reading:** There were suggestions on the programme that National Standards have meant a lessening of focus on other areas of the curriculum such as sporting, music and art. From the Campbells Bay School perspective I would suggest this has not happened and for evidence I refer to the annual school magazine that is jam packed full of such activities.

Overall, I believe we provide better programmes for our students than was the case a decade ago. This is not intended to be a political statement but, rather, a comment on the progress we have made when it comes to a focused improvement on the way we teach, assess, analyse, modify and report. It has not been all plain sailing. We make mistakes. When we make mistakes we do our best to learn from those mistakes. We will continue to work towards getting better.
