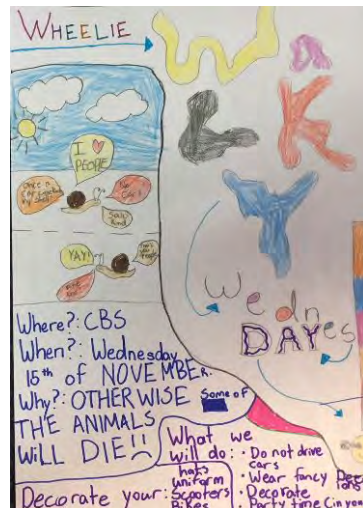
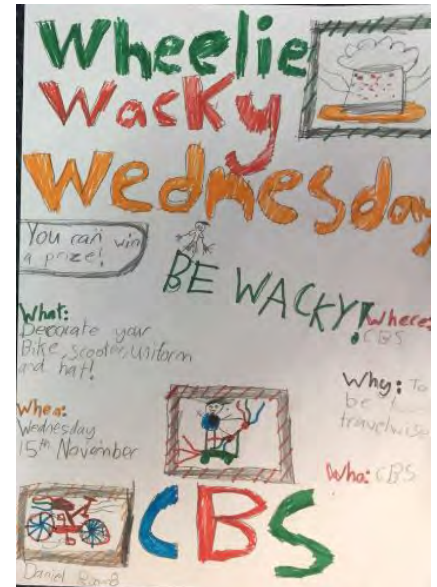

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## Watanabes' story – Leading Up To CBS (A Detour)

Our second stay in the city central quickly passed. When we said goodbye to the B&B owner he gave us a lot of towels. I felt his kind heart in them. He's been a good friend of ours since. We squeezed ourselves into our car packed with luggage and now we were back on the Shore. Our "base" was again Northcote motor camp. This time we were lucky. We were allocated to a room which was more spacious compared to the previous one. As soon as we moved into the motor camp, I received an email from the company I had just left. I thought it was a courtesy email asking how I was. I spotted a word "Salary" in the email subject line. The excitement surged through my mind (extra bonus!) but then another word in the subject line, which puzzled me to a great extent, came into my view. I opened the email.

The emails went like this:

**Subject: Overpayment of Salary**

*Dear Mr Watanabe,*

*We are sorry to inform you that we have overpaid your salary in Singapore dollars which has already been credited into your Singapore bank account on [Date].*

*Kindly do a bank transfer to ABC Corporation account as follows:*

*....*

*[Account details]*

*...*

*Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.*

*Please accept our apologies for the inconvenience of this situation.*

*Thank you.*

*Best Regards,*

*So-and-So (Ms)*

*ABC Corporation*

Overpayment ... I couldn't believe my eyes. We have just sorted out our NZ bank account and now we were facing another problem which was going on in Singapore. I didn't set up internet banking for the Singapore account because the account was, well, almost empty and no transactions were expected on that account. So there was no way of making bank transactions other than asking the bank via international calls. My prepaid mobile phone card didn't allow me to make any calls across the country borders. I explained to the company about my situation and asked them to wait but the company wanted to know "when" I would be able to make a bank transfer. There was a huge, fundamental gap between the company and me. They were organised and running on "certain schedules". On the other hand, we were unorganised and running on "uncertain schedules". However hard I tried to explain, it seemed to be hard for them to imagine. The only thing I was sure about was that we would move into a house soon. Eventually I could manage to make a bank transaction some days later.



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Anyway, there came the day when we would meet up with the owner of the house we had rented through Mr R, who appeared in episode two. The house owner was Mr H, whose children were (and one of them is still) at CBS. I used to think landlords (house owners) were people who were high above us (they are lords). When we arrived at the house, Mr H came out to greet us and I found that I was making a wrong assumption. He was really friendly. If I'm not mistaken, he was working together with his builder to get the house ready. It turned around my mentality 180 degrees. He said Campbells Bay School was a good school. And then he asked us "Have you guys already met Mr McGowan? He is the principal. He's a good person." While I was answering his question with "No, not yet", I thought to myself "I don't think we will ever see him. Principals are people who are sitting behind a large desk made of oak in a separate room and they are hardly to be seen by ordinary students or parents like us." As an intermediate student, my first-ever encounter (would-be) with the school principal was when I made a huge prank with good mates of mine in the morning that the senior students were sitting at a very important exam. We were running in the school corridor screaming like primates. When we finished our second (or third) screaming session, we saw the door of the deputy principal flung open and from there the angry deputy principal appeared and suddenly started charging towards us. We saw the anger was bubbling up on his face. My friend cried "My god! Deputy Principal!!! Run. RUN!!!!". Soon the principal learnt the incident and he got so angry about us that he instructed the lead teacher of our year to bring us to his room for a talk or two. But thanks to the leader's plea, we were pardoned. The high school I attended was so gigantic and had so many students that 200 meters was probably the closest distance I ever got to the principal. These experiences of mine formed my perceptions towards school principals so we weren't imagining that we would meet Mr McGowan soon.



A few days later we came back to the house for the inventory check. We knocked on the door and there was a lady standing in the kitchen with a broad smile. It was Mrs H. She began her talk with a friendly greeting, which was great but she was talking very fast. I became speechless because I was just too busy trying to pick up the words she was saying. And then I caught one phrase. "I might be talking fast. I'm a typical Kiwi woman.". Yes. I heard the word "typical". I interpreted the word as "standard". I remember saying in my mind "This speed and accent ... Oh ... dangerous combination ...". My confidence level got quite low. However, the positive aspect was that it turned out, just like Mr H, Mrs H was very nice and kind. In terms of people, we were very lucky. All the people we met were very nice and kind. Since our first encounter, Mrs H has been sort of a barometer for my progress in my Kiwi English. One of my dreams is I outspoke Mrs H. I don't think it will happen but a dream cannot be too big, can it?

We couldn't ship our belongings when we left Singapore because we didn't have a delivery address. Luckily the shipping company was providing a service to put shipments on hold at the Singapore port. Now that we got a delivery address, our belongings could finally depart for New Zealand. My mental diary, which is not so accurate, tells we moved into the house on 8th of February, 2014. The luggage we brought into the country occupied  $\frac{3}{4}$  of our car but when we spread them out in the house, it was nothing. Even after we put up our beds on our first day, it still felt empty as you can see from the photos. We ate on cardboard boxes, which the beds came in, the beds until the shipment arrived a few months later.

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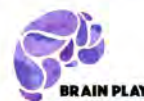
