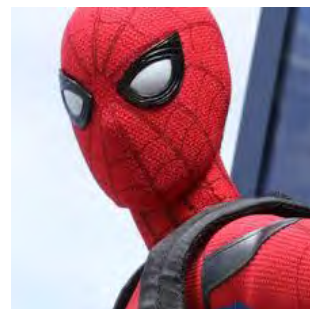
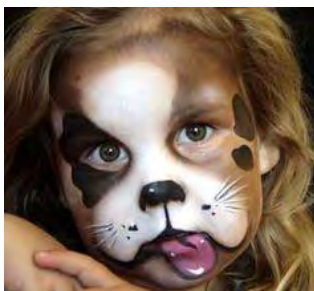
## Mathathon

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## Pedestrian Crossing Improvements: East Coast Road

Sandra Teasdale, a parent of our school, raised the issue of improving the safety of the pedestrian crossing (to the south of the Aberdeen Road intersection) with Auckland Transport. Their reply is as follows:

'Further to your phone call with an Auckland Transport engineer on 24 April 2017, we have now completed our investigation into your concerns regarding pedestrian safety in East Coast Road. Thank you for your patience while we looked into this matter and compiled this response for you.



Despite that the crossing is located not on an ideal location which is on a gentle bend, our site investigation indicated the crossing is visible to the approaching traffic. Additionally, all the warning signs, road markings, poles and lights are appropriately placed to provide sufficient warning to oncoming drivers to slow down and stop for pedestrians.

To further enhance safety at this crossing, we propose to make the following minor improvements:

- Repaint the zebra crossing markings;
- Install tactiles;
- Repaint the traffic islands;
- Repaint the limit lines;
- Reinstall (Reflective Raised Pavement Markers) RRPMS.

Those works can expect to be done within next two to three months.'

Thanks to Sandra for sharing her concerns and achieving some action. As the letter from Auckland Transport (AT) outlines, the crossing is not in an ideal location. As I remember it, the crossing was put there after lobbying by the school and others as an interim measure to improve pedestrian safety until AT installed traffic lights at the intersection of East Coast and Aberdeen Roads. I am not sure what has happened to the traffic lights! Still, it is good to read AT will be enhancing the safety measures around the crossing.

## Driveways

Pedestrians have the right-of-way over vehicles when vehicles are entering or exiting a driveway across a footpath (or using a drive way to turn around). Motorists should exit their driveways slowly and stop to check there are no people walking before proceeding over the footpath.



Concern has been expressed about some driver behaviour when using driveways to turn around before and after school when children are on the footpaths in large numbers.

Please be alert to the presence of children and remember: Pedestrians have right-of-way over vehicles when vehicles are crossing driveways and children are often unpredictable.

Please also be mindful of parking near neighbours of CBS driveways. Please allow them enough room to safely enter and exit their driveways at all times.

## Police Vetting: Urgent & Important!

Only adults who have had a police vet will be able to help with school activities from January 2017 onwards.

As obtaining a police vet takes time, if you are considering being available to help with school activities in any way in 2017 please act now, as follows.....

Please go to the school website to 'Police Vetting for Volunteers at CBS' under Parent Information and complete the form and attach photocopies as per the instructions.

Please note a police vet remains current for three years after the date of issue by the police.

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## Visitors to CBS

Today we welcome two members of the Education Review Office (ERO) to the school as part of their review of the Resource Teachers Learning and Support (RTLBS) for the North Shore.

Campbells Bay School is the school responsible for the provision of this service to all state and integrated primary, intermediate and secondary schools on the North Shore - all 71 of them. The 30 RTLBS provide support and guidance to schools for students who have, as the name suggests (!) learning or behavioural issues. ERO is reviewing all 40 RTLBS clusters across the country and will report to the Government on the effectiveness of the RTLBS. (No RTLBS are actually based at CBS. They work from accommodation at Birkdale School, Northcote Intermediate and offices in Rosedale Road).

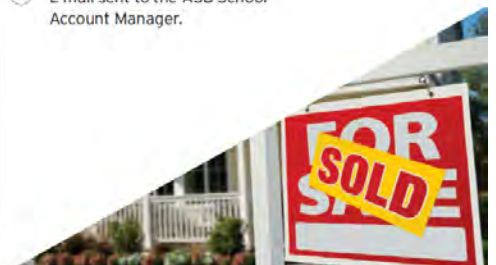

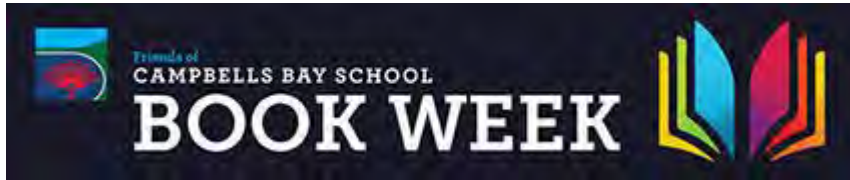
