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Staffing News

On Friday of this week Sandra Stott (Room 7) leaves our school to take up a position at Kohimarama School. Sandra is making this move to avoid the trek between the eastern suburbs and CBS - something that has become increasingly burdensome. Sandra has been a vital part of our teaching team since 2003 and she will be greatly missed. Her work both inside and outside the classroom has made a very real contribution to CBS and we thank Sandra for her commitment and extend to her our very best wishes. Sandra is being replaced by Elsabe van Dyk, who is moving from a school in the eastern suburbs! Elsabe will start at CBS tomorrow so there will be an overlap in Room 7 for the rest of the week providing for a great transition.

A new entrant class opens today in a refurbished classroom (Room 32). Christine McLean, our learning hub teacher, will be the teacher for this class for the first four weeks of this term until Angela Brown, a teacher from Kristin School, is contractually able to commence her teaching role at our school. Through the media you will probably be aware of the extreme shortage of teachers in the Auckland region. It is in this context that we are pleased to be in a position of being fully staffed and with the teachers for the two new entrant classrooms to open before the end of this year already appointed.

In addition, today we welcome Jo Coughlan and Nicolette Land, additional teachers to provide with class release for teachers in accordance with the employment contract and to support classroom teaching programmes. It is a real bonus to be able to employ Jo and Nicolette in these positions, particularly in the context of the teacher shortage.

Room Nine raise \$140 for KidsCan Charitable Trust

Last term the students in room nine learned all about respect via the making and playing of games. They were charged with the idea of inventing their own games to demonstrate their learning. Some made board games, others computer games and in art, they made a giant snakes and ladders. When the students had completed their task, the students were asked what they wanted to do with their learning. What came out of the class discussion was amazing! The discussion turned to homelessness and how it worried them - these students are six, seven and eight years old! They collectively decided to turn the classroom into a games arcade, inviting others to come and play the games that they had invented, for a donation. They researched what charity might be appropriate and they decided upon KidsCan Charitable Trust.

After the last (of five) games arcade events, the students had raised \$140. KidsCan were so impressed with the students work that they sent a representative (Sene - pictured) to congratulate the children and collect the donation. The work of these students and the collaborative way in which they achieved their goal is the true essence of 'Not self but service'. Well done room nine!



Refurbished Classrooms

2017 Mathathon



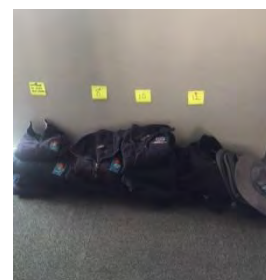

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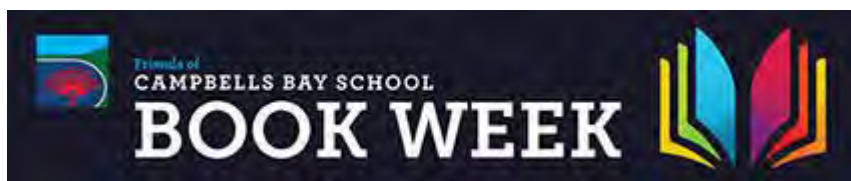
Campbells Bay School is registered for the **Mud Monster Mud Rush** which runs **Sat 9th / Sunday 10th September**.

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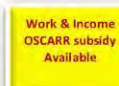

Building Confidence

From learning robotics, and creative writing to becoming a Maths Wizard, the benefits in participating are huge. Whether that is discovering a new passion, or receiving a confidence boost by mastering a math's concept, the benefits are life changing!

Robotics
