Associate Principals: 2018

As a result of a review of the leadership structure of the school, particularly in the content of a growing student role, the Board of Trustees approved a modified structure to be effective from January 2018.

The organisation has one deputy principal (Rachael Aitken) who will have three associate principals reporting to her. While the associate principals will have a myriad of tasks, their main task will be to lead teaching teams and all that this entails. They will also provide release for teachers in their teams under the classroom release programme as mandated by the teachers' collective agreement.

This means all associate teachers will have regular contact with all students under their care. As a result of the decision to move to this structure the associate principals will not be classroom teachers from 2018 onwards with the caveat they will be spending regular time in classrooms as outlined.

We congratulate Nathan Janes, Christie Jury and Patricia Meder on their appointments to the associate principal roles. Full details of the 2018 school organisation will be contained in the 2018 Organisation booklet that will be published when parents are notified of class placements for 2018.

Our Sorry Field

We had to postpone the junior cross country last week even though the sun had been shining for a couple of days and, shock horror, it hadn't rained for at least 24 hours! The amount of rain we have had in recent weeks coupled with, what I suspect, is a block in our field drainage system, has resulted in swamp-like conditions on the field. (I note the Meteorological Service has stated this is the wettest January - September period in Auckland since 1962 so the amount of rain has certainly been a major contributor to our wet, wet field).



If this wet continues colonies of frogs will probably make the field their home. Although the field drainage problem does not have the national implications of a recent problem with a broken pipeline, it does have a very real impact on the school. We are having the drainage issue investigated by people who know about these things with the intention of having whatever is getting in the way of a quick draining field fixed in time for next winter.

In the meantime, apologies for the postponement the other day. However, after donning gumboots and walking gingerly over the entire field I still got muddy. The spectre of hundreds of small feet pounding the wet and muddy field didn't bear thinking about given the fact we would have had hundreds of wet and muddy small children at the end of the events. While they may have enjoyed it, for the moment, our resources of spare dry clothing would not have coped!

Bring on some sunshine for term four and a fix for the field drainage.

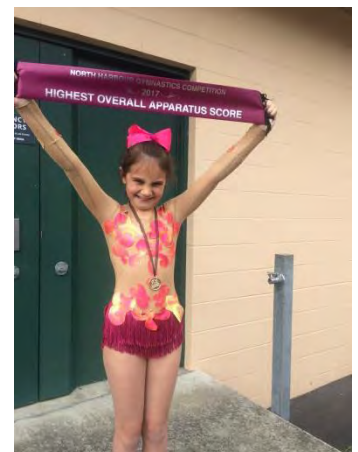
Student Success: Congratulations Angela!

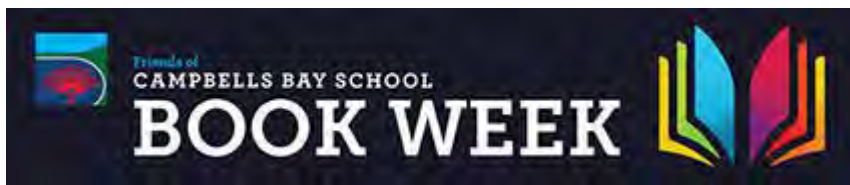

June Pitman-Hayes is a creative writer, singer-songwriter, lyricist and poet of Ngāpuhi, Ngāti Wai, Ngāti Pūkenga and Ngāti Maniapoto descent. Brought up on the shores of Tamaterau, a tiny settlement that hugs the Whangarei Heads Coast Road east of Whangarei, June was the youngest of three mokopuna raised largely by her maternal Māori grandmother, Tiria, who allowed her the freedom to roam the natural surroundings, develop her own appreciation for the natural world at a very early age, and her ability to see beyond what was immediately apparent to the visible eye. "Look into a dewdrop captured in a flower, and then look deeper to really see what is within. This is where the magic is!" June says. It was her mother, however, who encouraged her daughter's natural ability for music and song. June is one of Aotearoa's well-known jazz singers, having performed at many events and festivals throughout the country. She also recently recorded the music to Joy Cowley's Hush: A Kiwi Lullaby for a book & CD combination for Scholastic NZ.

The idea for Tāwhirimātea, A Song for Matariki, arrived with the wind one very blustery winter's morning in June 2015. Both melody and lyric presented easily and effortlessly, and within thirty minutes a new and catchy waiata had been created. Tāwhirimātea's lyrics not only evoke an understanding of the magic of our universe in duality, but also highlights values for living life: sharing, whānau connectedness, respect for our elders, and the spurning of greed, all of which is underpinned in the belief that Matariki (the Maori New Year), is a time to gather family and friends together, to reflect and honour the past, celebrate the present, and plan for the future.
