### Anti Bullying Friday

As schools are part of society the influences that underpin bullying are found in schools as they are elsewhere. Our job is to make sure we are constantly alert to bullying that might occur and then to do something about it. We can only do this with the support of our community. Hence, if you are concerned about any instances of bullying in the school context please alert your child's teacher. Depending on the nature and extent of the bullying your child's teacher may either investigate themselves or call upon the assistance of their team leader. Of course, it is often the case that an incident of bullying is not clear cut as there are often two sides to a story. In fact, often the more we investigate the more we find there are more than two sides! You can be assured that we do our best to investigate and ensure justice prevails within the limitations of the resources at our disposal.

If you have an on-going concern about a bullying issue please make the time to come and see me.

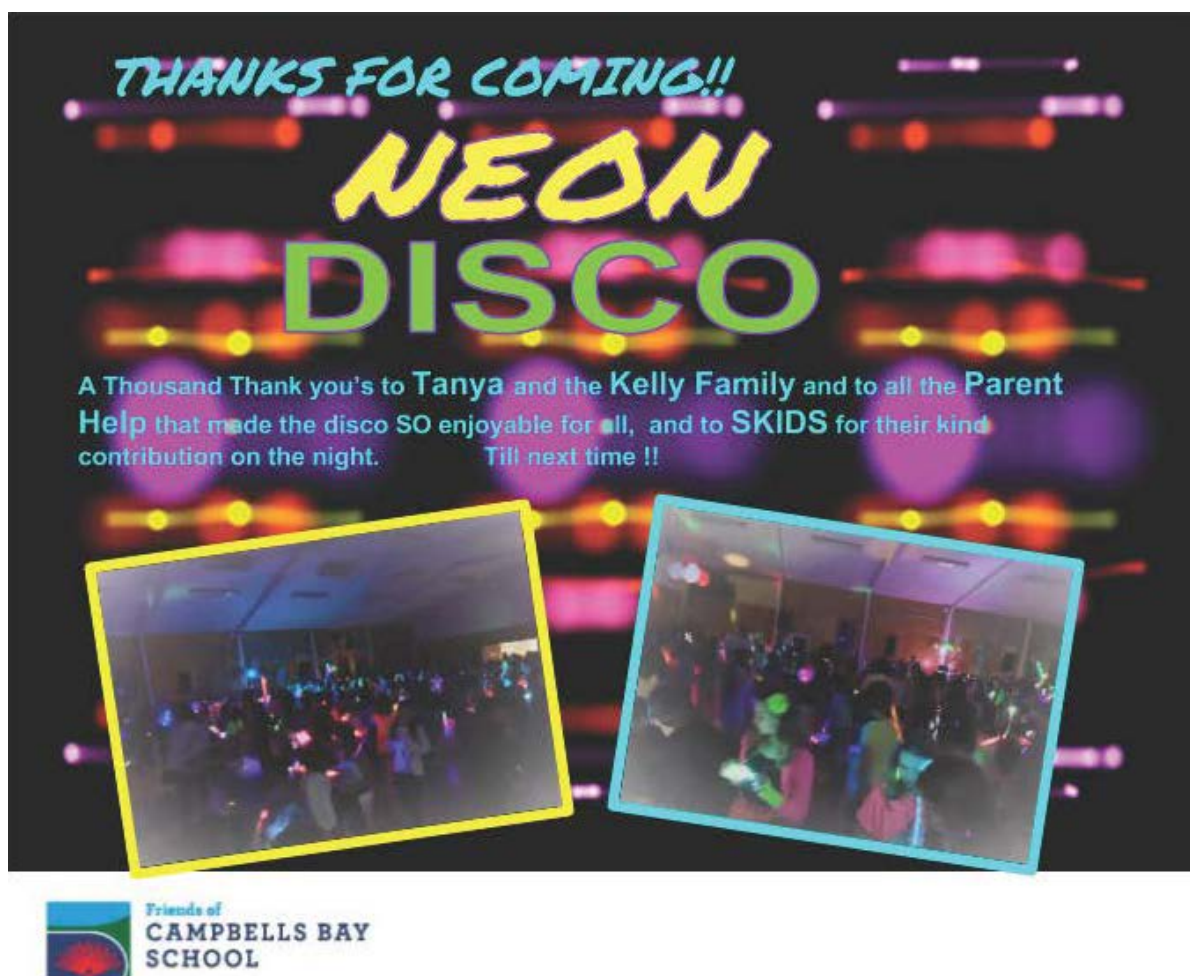
