Swimming Pool Access

The Board of Trustees has made the decision **not** to continue with the swimming pool key access programme.



The Board made this decision with regret. The decision has been made to ensure the school complies with NZS5826:2010 that requires the pool water quality to be under 'continuous technical supervision.'

Further, given the size of the pool, there is a limit to the number of people who can use the pool in a day (160). With the key holder system we have no way of monitoring the daily usage of the pool, nor do we have the ability to continuously monitor the water quality outside of school hours by a suitably qualified person. In our case the suitably qualified person is our caretaker who has appropriate training to maintain the pool. Hence, the decision not to continue with the key access system.



eZlunch Mates

Last term, when the Student Council attended the North Shore Young Leaders' Conference, we found out that a lot of children in Auckland are going to school each day without any lunch. This inspired us to find a way that we can help. We discovered the Ezlunch Mates system, which is providing lunches to children who would otherwise go hungry.

You can help by choosing to be an Ezlunch Mate by logging into our school payment portal and clicking on the option called Ezlunch Mates. This will lead you through the payment process. You will be giving a lunch to a child in Auckland who might not get lunch every day. You can do this at the same time as ordering your child's lunch, or just purchase a Mates lunch on it's own. This means you could choose to gift a lunch even when your child is not ordering a lunch.

I'm sure you will agree that being fed is a basic human right and it is sad that some children are missing out on meals. We hope you will partner with us to support this worthy cause in the spirit of 'Not Self But Service'.

On Tuesday 12 September, our year four to six CBS cross country team runners competed in our cluster inter school cross country race at Sunnynook Park. Wow! Wow! Wow! Our team put on an outstanding performance and every single runner contributed towards a fantastic end result.

Each of the participating schools had 6 runners per race. One point is awarded to the runner in first place, two points to the runner in second, five points to fifth place, twenty-five points to twenty-fifth place and so on. At the end of the six races, each school's points are added up and the school with the lowest score wins the winning school's trophy. Every runner from number 1 to 6 was important and everyone's result countered. Our runners truly participated as a team and every runner gave more than their best effort.

Our year four girls were first up and set the bar high. They finished in first, second, fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh positions! What an incredible achievement. Our year five boys had an amazing race too with all six of our runners placing in the top ten. All the year groups worked so hard and finished with amazing results. When the final results were read out, CBS came out as top school, winning the trophy for the second year running! ☺

Our four top finishers in each age group then went on to participate at the first ever super cluster cross country event held at Rosedale Park on the last Tuesday of term three. This event saw two clusters joining together and eight primary schools from CBS to Browns Bay competing for the inaugural super cluster cross country shield.

The course was pretty grueling with most of the course run in very long, thick grass. The course definitely had more of a "real" cross country element to it. Once again our year four girls started with a bang and finished in first, fourth, sixth and



fiftieth positions. Again, the year five boys were outstanding with all four of our runners finishing in the top ten. Our year six boys sealed the deal with finishing first, third and fourth.

The team was delighted to receive top school and to be the first recipients of the super cluster cross country shield. Hard work definitely pays off!

Thank you to all the team runners, including the reserves, who attended the running club and the team training sessions during the whole of term three. Thank you also to all the parents and family members who helped with course walk-throughs and preparation and for those that came out to support us at the two inter school events.

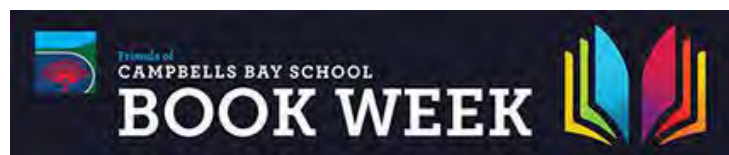

Watanabes' story – The Next Installment

We spent our first three or four days in central Auckland. The B&B where we were staying was near K-Road so the very first thing we did the following day was to explore the street. The B&B owner told us there was an Asian supermarket where we could get Asian food and ingredients (for cheap - that was important). It was a fine, sunny day but a little bit chilly. To be honest with you, my heart sank a little bit. Although it was the middle of the summer, it was not hot enough for me. Maybe it was because we only left Singapore the day before and my body still recognised “a temperature of 30 degrees” as hot enough. Walking in the street, I was wondering whether the sea was warm enough for swimming...

The B&B owner was really nice to us. He gave us a lot of information about this country which was helpful in planning our next move. It was a weekend (we flew in to New Zealand on Friday night). In addition, we had Auckland Anniversary which was not in our calculation, so there wasn't much we could do in terms of setting up our new life such as bank account etc. I can't recall exactly what we were doing for the first few days except we took long walks to know the central area. As you can imagine, four pairs of feet and a pram did not take us far. The longest walk was to Mt. Eden. We desperately needed the vehicle which was supposed to be handed over to us shortly.

Thinking about the next accommodation was a huge headache. While we were getting ready to leave Singapore, Makiko was looking into the Auckland regions and she got good impression on North Shore. On the other hand, I wanted to go south just because I like the word “south”. For a person who is from the northern hemisphere, south means “warm” or “tropical” but I completely forgot we were in the southern hemisphere where everything is opposite. Anyway I had done almost no research on the Auckland regions so I agreed that we would try to find an accommodation in North Shore. I often tell my children not to rely on the internet for the solution but ironically I was the one who were heavily relying upon the internet to find the solution. I googled and googled. Our situation was narrowing down the options ... and we found it. A motor lodge in Northcote. Now we were in the car and on our way to the motor lodge. We were about to get out of Auckland CBD driving onto the Harbour Bridge. It was another bright sunny day. We reached the top of the bridge ... and .. “Wow!” we all roared, literally roared. The view from the top of the bridge was stunning. Blue sky and blue ocean which was sparkling with tiny diamonds. Just incredibly wonderful. I thought to myself that the children who were born and growing up here are very lucky because this stunning view is close by them. At the moment I saw that panorama view, I thought we would try to find a place to live on North Shore.

We could see North Shore just over there and before long, we arrived at the motor lodge. It would have been much sooner if I hadn't hesitated and eventually made a wrong turn at a roundabout. (I never imagined this roundabout was going to be one of the roundabouts which I very often pass). We very much enjoy camping but we didn't have a tent then. We booked a small room in a second-storey lodge from which we were operating. “Operating” sounds great but again there wasn't much we could do so we decided to focus on property search. We called and emailed property agents and some agents had properties which suited us. One of the agents who came back to us was Mr. R. (Later we found out that his child was in the same class as one of our children. What a coincidence!). He showed us two houses and the second one was located in Campbells Bay School zone. Mr R was very nice and polite to us, who were still very new in this country, which hit our hot-button. It was, too, a bright sunny day just like the day of our arrival in North Shore. When we exchanged “see you later”, we were standing on the hill and behind him the skies were blue. With a nice person and nice view, there were reasons for us to have a look at the other areas. Although I said we would think and get back to him later, the final decision had already been made before we got in the car.

Serious tree damage on the Avenue of Remembrance

Dear neighbour

Several large pohutukawa in Centennial Park have been severely damaged. One has been topped by about 60%. Another has had several large branches removed. The trees are in the Avenue of Remembrance near the Rae Rd entrance to the park.

These trees are protected by virtue of being in the reserve and are highly prized by the community. They have historical significance being planted to commemorate the New Zealand Centenary in 1940 but also have significance to returned servicemen as each tree was once marked with the name of a soldier.

We believe this damage occurred on or about Friday 20th October by a tree contractor. In order to prosecute the offender/s we need witnesses and evidence.
