# Head Lice Outbreak

## HOW CAN I TELL IF MY CHILD HAS HEAD LICE?



Your child may have an itchy scalp, especially around the nape of the neck, crown and ears. You may see live lice on the scalp, or hard, pale grey or yellow-white eggs (nits) like grains of salt attached to the hair, close to the scalp. Or the first indication you may have is when the school tells you there's an outbreak.

## HOW DO I TREAT THEM?

The key to dealing with lice is to check, treat and inform.

**1. Check:** Check your child's hair regularly - once a week is a good guide. In the past, teachers and public health nurses lined kids up for public and humiliating checks at school. These days schools don't do checks so it's up to you to check at home.

**2. Treat:** If you find live lice or unhatched eggs, treat your child as soon as you can. Your chemist can advise you on the best way to deal with the problem. Treatments don't need to be expensive, although they can be time-consuming, for example using a fine-toothed comb every day. Chemical treatments or wet combing are the usual ways to treat head lice.

## CHEMICAL TREATMENTS

- Chemical treatments use a special shampoo or lotion that kills the head lice and the eggs. Follow the instructions that are supplied with the chemical treatments.
- Always do a second treatment 7–10 days after the first. This is to kill any head lice that may have hatched after the first treatment.
- For head lice that have built up immunity to over the counter treatments, there is a prescription only product called DIMETHICONE lotion and it is very effective and subsidized for you. Talk to your pharmacist, doctor or nurse for advice. Ordinary shampoo or soap will not kill head lice. Do not use fly spray, kerosene or animal treatments, as these may harm children.

## WET COMBING

- Wet the hair and scalp with conditioner (this makes it easier to see the head lice).
- Use a fine-toothed comb to check for head lice and eggs and to comb them out. It's best to use a fine metal comb, or a special head lice comb you can get from a pharmacy.
- Comb the full length of the hair, from the scalp to the ends. Work your way around the head so that you have combed all of the hair.
- If you see any head lice or eggs, clean the comb by wiping it on a tissue or a paper towel, or rinse the comb before you use it again.
- After you have combed all of the hair, rinse out the conditioner.
- Repeat the wet combing each week until you don't find any more head lice or eggs.

## Police Vetting: Urgent & Important!

Only adults who have had a police vet will be able to help with school activities from January 2017 onwards.

As obtaining a police vet takes time, if you are considering being available to help with school activities in any way in 2017 please act now, as follows.....

Please go to the school website to 'Police Vetting for Volunteers at CBS' under Parent Information and complete the form and attach photocopies as per the instructions.

Please note a police vet remains current for three years after the date of issue by the police.

## Absences

Just a reminder that if your child is going to be absent from school, we request you advise the school office before 9am, **not just the class teacher.**

This is a Ministry of Education requirement.

We work very hard at keeping your children safe at school and appreciate your assistance with our process.

**3. Inform:** Let the school know when your child has lice or nits. They can then tell other parents that there is an outbreak, so everyone can check and treat their own children. Teachers can make adjustments in the classroom – such as removing the ‘dress-up’ box and keeping hats in student’s bags, not in a box altogether, or reducing close group work where students’ heads are touching. Until the infestation is over,

#### **WILL MY CHILD HAVE TO STAY AWAY FROM SCHOOL?**

No, the school shouldn’t exclude your child or ask you to keep them at home because they have lice. You don’t need to keep your child at school while you’re treating lice either.

#### **HOW CAN I STOP MY CHILD GETTING HEAD LICE?**

Head lice are really common in children. There are some things you can do to help prevent them:

- brush your child’s hair every day (or remind them to do this)
- don’t share brushes, combs, towels or hats
- check that the school doesn’t store children’s hats all together
- check your child’s hair for lice regularly, and act straight away if you find any
- you don’t need to shave your child’s hair, but it can help to keep it short or tied up when at school.

#### **WHAT CAN I DO IF MY CHILD KEEPS GETTING RE-INFESTED?**

It is very frustrating when you have treated your child and find they keep getting re-infested. Tell the school every time your child comes home with a fresh batch of lice – so that the whole school community can take responsibility for the problem. If head lice are an ongoing problem the public health nurse may assist the school to provide information and advice to parents.

It’s also common for children to re-infest themselves - it only takes a stray nit or lice to start the cycle again. Make sure you complete any treatment, keep checking, and follow the prevention tips.

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## Park safely and keep our kids safe

This year our school is participating in Auckland Transport's 'Safety at the School Gate' programme. Drivers who stop in the wrong place to drop off passengers put the safety of children at risk. Parking officers will be on patrol outside the school this year and will be issuing tickets to drivers who park illegally.

The agreed approach is 'zero tolerance' – There will be no warnings issued, you will receive a ticket if you are double parked, parked on yellow lines, or over someone's driveway – or for any other vehicle safety offence.

Please park legally to keep our children safe and to avoid being ticketed.

## Park safely outside schools

Before and after school is a busy time for everyone. Parking rules help protect our children and keep them safe. Drivers who park illegally put our kids at risk.

This term parking officers will be on patrol outside your school to issue tickets to those who are illegally parked.

### Fines for illegal parking include:

| • Parked within 6m either side of an unmarked bus stop                                     | \$40 |

| • Parked within 0.5m of a fire hydrant with no one in the car legally capable of moving it | \$60 |
| • Parked within a designated bus lane, transit or cycle lane                               | \$60 |
| • Parked on a clearway   | \$60 |
| • Double parked  | \$60 |
| • Inconsiderate parking to other road users, including pedestrians                         | \$60 |
| • Parked on or within 6m of an intersection  | \$60 |
| • Parked on a pedestrian crossing  | \$60 |
| • Parked on a broken yellow line   | \$60 |

*These parking offences are detailed in the New Zealand Road Code.*

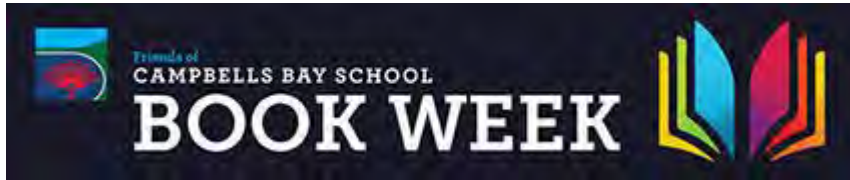


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Monday 27 November to Friday 1 December.
