## Leadership at CBS from Today

The resignation of Nikki Ulrich as a deputy principal has provided the opportunity for leadership responsibilities for members of our teaching team. When constructing the organisation for the balance of the year we were mindful we had an abundance of talent we wanted to utilize without disrupting classes. Some people will retain their previous roles while there are some new faces at the leadership table. We have ensured all classroom teachers in the new leadership organisation will continue as classroom teachers so there will be no disruption of classes.

The basis of the revised leadership organisation is to ensure that the three leaders in each of the three teams work together with each team leader reporting to Rachael Aitken, deputy principal, who in turn reports to me. While each leader has a number of specific duties, the over arching duties for each leader are as follows. **Team Leader**: Pastoral care of students and teachers; over all leadership of the team's teaching and learning, curriculum and assessment; and team administrative duties. **Learning Leader (Teacher Inquiry)**: Leading data analysis of student achievement in order to investigate ways of improving teaching to improve student achievement. The heart of this role is targeting professional development to ensure it is tailored to identified student learning needs. **Learning Leader (Student Inquiry)**: Leading curriculum planning for class programmes. Please bear in mind, while this describes the essence of the duties, the roles encompass many other duties.

## Professional Development Day

On Friday teachers in schools from Campbells Bay to Browns Bay, including Murrays Bay Intermediate, met to share knowledge on 'what works' to improve outcomes for students. The day started with a key note address to remind us of the challenges of preparing our students for an ever changing world\*. There was then a series of 39 workshops on the theme of sharing what is working in our schools. We are extremely fortunate to work in an area where schools work together so well. A day such as Friday was an example that 'we are all in this together so let's share what works' and try and figure out what is not working so well and what we can do about that. Although Rangitoto College did not release all their teachers to attend this event, they did provide teachers to lead some workshops. Of the 39 workshop options across the day Campbells Bay teachers led nine of these, some individually and some in teams.



Thank you to: Nathan Janes, Rachael Aitken, Charlotte Borowski, Nikki Urlich (last day as deputy at CBS!), Patricia Meder, Christie Jury, Chris Mashlan, Sarah Whitaker and Joe Lanning for sharing your professional knowledge with your colleagues. It was an uplifting day with a great deal of sharing and a great deal of learning. We are aware having such a day is an inconvenience to some, while also providing an opportunity for others to extend a three day weekend away into a four day event. It is entirely possible we will plan for such a day again next year. In this context you can be assured we will be open for instruction for the required number of days.



\* Quite coincidentally, I was listening to a programme on Radio New Zealand at the weekend that looked at where the often quoted statistic that '65% of students will be employed in jobs that don't exist yet' actually comes from. According to the seemingly knowledgeable researchers interviewed on the programme they were not able to identify the root source of the research that this statement is based on. While the researchers were quoted various sources, when they dug a little deeper they could not find the original peer reviewed source. It seems the '65%.....' statement may well be urban myth and that makes sense as it is really difficult to predict what things are going to be like five years hence let alone when today's five year old students leave school in or around 2030. I think the best position to take is that we know we are preparing students for a world that will challenge them because of constant change, not only in

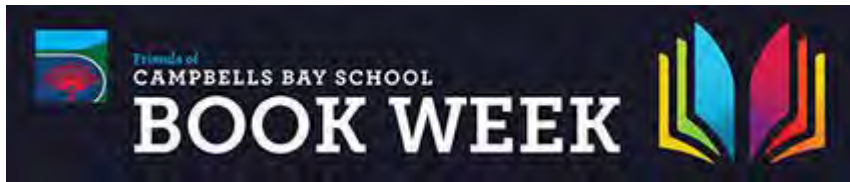

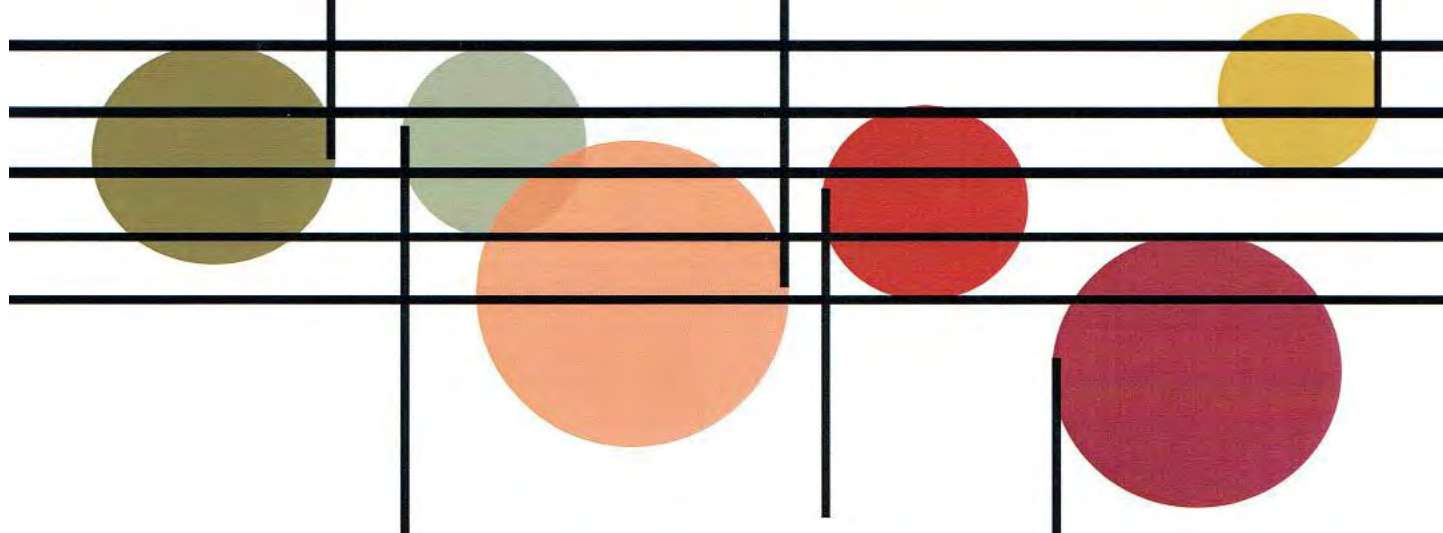
