Explanation of Annual costs and School Donation

Aquatics programme Water safety is critical for our students and because of this we are taking all Year 4-6 students to the Mairangi Bay Surf Lifesaving Club for a Beach Education Day early in Term 1. This is run by fully qualified lifeguards providing practical water skills in a real beach setting. It includes clubhouse, beach and water activities. Students use critical thinking in order to learn life-saving knowledge; including how to identify and escape from rip currents and how to practise safe, fun ocean activities in a controlled environment.

The learning doesn't stop here! We are also taking Year 5 to the Vector Wero Whitewater Park in Term 4. Qualified instructors will teach students to assess dynamic river environments and basic hydrology. The students will then learn a variety of techniques to safely cross the Tamariki River white water course before having the chance to swim across the rapids.

In Year 6 students participate in the Waterwise Programme at Lake Pupuke. It supports students with opportunities to explore and develop confidence in and around the water. We introduce basic skills in sailing optimist boats and kayaking. To prepare for this, in Term 4, our Year 5 students attend AUT Millennium for an introductory session. This is led by our trained instructors and teachers to ensure they are ready to participate in the programme at Lake Pupuke. This involves kayak entry and exit, developing deep water confidence and doing an optimist boat capsize.

Mathletics is an online programme that helps students to engage and enjoy maths as well as improving their results. All children will have the opportunity to take part so we strongly recommend participation in this programme. This is used as part of the student's home learning to support mathematics progress and achievement.

School Magazine full colour magazine which contains a summary of the year at school, issued at the end of term four, is available for purchase.

School Donation, Activity Contribution and Class Consumables

The School Donation is a voluntary payment and therefore it is not compulsory, but it is a critical aspect of the school financial status. We try to be as efficient as possible in running the school and to continue to do this we do need your support. Donations can also be paid by automatic payment instalments. To do this please set up an automatic payment with your bank, please contact the school office for school bank details. *Please note that your school donation payment may be eligible for a 33% tax rebate by Inland Revenue. Please note that Campbells Bay School did not meet the Ministry of Education's criteria for receiving a grant rather than requesting donations from their community: the schools eligibility had to have an EQI (Equity Index) of 432 and above, and our school is 347. We unfortunately, do have to rely on a top up from the amazing support of our community to fund our school's opportunities and resources that make us so unique. We also accept international students to off-set some of the financial pressures for the school.

Activity Contribution and Class Allowance contributes to part of the total costs for each student to participate in class trips out of school, cultural performances, expert visitors to the class and additional classroom resources and stationery. This does not cover any additional sporting or cultural event costs that your child may be invited to attend, or EOTC (Education Outside the Classroom) camp experiences.
